CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER NO. 33: UPDATED CASE CATEGORIZATION PROCESS

The Court entered its original case categorization order in October and November 2018 respectively. *See* Filing Nos. 9322 & 9638. The categorization process allows for classification of cases based on claimed injury or complication and certification of those claims through accompanying medical records. *See* Filing Nos. 9638 & 9638-1. The categorization requirement, along other required disclosures, applies to all cases filed or transferred to this Court per the terms of Fourth Amended Case Management Order ("CMO") No. 4; *see also* Filing No. 10617 (extending categorization requirement to new cases).

To facilitate the collection of more complete and accurate information about the cases pending before this Court, the Court has amended the process outlined in CMO-4, and its related attachments moving forward, in the Fifth Amended CMO-4. *See* Filing No. 25599. To ensure accurate and complete information is collected on all the cases currently pending in this MDL, the Court further **ORDERS** as follows:

1. All Plaintiffs must review the Fifth Amended CMO-4, and submit the

information required by and outlined in it and its attachments within thirty (30) days of this

Order.

2. For those Plaintiffs who previously submitted Plaintiff Profile Sheets and

Case Categorization Forms prior to the Fifth Amended CMO-4: (1) Plaintiffs are not

required to submit new and/or updated Plaintiff Profile Sheets; however, (2) Plaintiffs are

required to submit a new Case Categorization Form (attached as Exhibit 2 to the Fifth

Amended CMO-4); and (3) submit the Amount in Controversy Certification attached as

Exhibit 3 to the Fifth Amended CMO-4 (if applicable)), within 30 days of this Order.

3. Plaintiffs who previously provided information pursuant to the Fourth

Amended CMO-4 that fail to provide the information outlined in Paragraph 2 of this Order

within thirty (30) days of this Order will be treated as non-compliant and subject to the

non-compliance process set forth in Paragraph 3 of the Fourth Amended CMO-4 (also

found in Paragraph 4 of the Fifth Amended CMO-4).
